#### Survivor - Kenneth Freitas



Cancer does not know any age quidelines.

Arroyo Grande resident Kenneth Freitas was stunned when two years ago, at age 40, he learned that he had colorectal cancer.

Freitas' battle began with the discovery of blood in his feces. His

first doctor told him to "wait and see" because it "probably was a hemorrhoid." He considers himself lucky because he did opt for a colonoscopy. "I was diagnosed as Stage Three. I'm amazed over the advances (and speed) we're making in the fight against cancer... especially when you realize it takes 10 years of testing before we get to use something."

After radiation; chemotherapy; surgery to resection his colon; more "chemo"; and even more surgery to re-section his colon and replace his "bag", he and wife, Amber find reason to celebrate every day. "Yes, I live more for the moment and treasure everything," the Cal Poly grad and Certified Public Accountant said over a morning cup of coffee. Ken's recovery involves their family which includes daughter Katey, who will be five in January. Ken and Amber recently opened the South Halcyon Road office of Ace Accounting, CPA.

A speaker at September's JCPF Celebration, Freitas said that because of medications, he is more careful about his diet but physically does not feel any weaker than prior to his diagnosis. "I was more measured. I had to carefully plan everything."

Ken is so grateful and hopeful for his future. The recent loss of his aunt Christine Freitas, due to lung cancer, makes him even more aware of the ravages cancer can have on our life.

# Update from Dr. David Palchak

PCR Oncology was admitted to a Mayo Clinic research group, named ACCRU (see below) in October. We were already members of the Alliance for Clinical Trials in Oncology, the National Cancer Institute sponsored research group headed by the Mayo Clinic. Our patients now have access to all of the clinical trials available through Mayo Clinic research groups because of the sponsorship of the JPCF.



Membership in ACCRU improves options for local patients, providing them with access to new drugs, not yet available through NCI sponsored trials. Within days of being accepted into ACCRU we have had patients interested in their trials. The support of our community has permitted



us to create a research organization that is both small in terms of personnel, and large when measured by the number of clinical trials available to our patients. Thank you for your support.

#### Academic and Community Cancer Research United

The Academic and Community Cancer Research United (ACCRU) is a clinical research group whose operations are based at the Mayo Clinic Cancer Center in Rochester, Minn. ACCRU includes a network of more than 60 academic and community-based cancer treatment clinics and hospitals in the United States and Canada. ACCRU, was established in 2004 to conduct clinical trials to improve cancer care. (Go to ACCRU.org for more information.)

#### What Are Clinical Trials?


As a Clinical Investigator, Dr. Palchak has been conducting cancer research through clinical trials since 1994, in cooperation with the National Cancer Institute (NCI), the Cancer and Leukemia Group B, and the Clinical Trials Support Unit.

Clinical trials are research studies which patients volunteer to take part in to find better ways of detecting, diagnosing, treating and preventing cancer. Many treatments used today are the result of past clinical trials.

Strict national and international regulations and policies have been developed to protect the rights, safety, and well-being of people who take part in clinical trials. They also ensure that trials are conducted according to strict scientific and ethical principles.
