arrived at UC San Francisco for an audit of quality of care and quality of research, as is required of every participant in human subjects research programs. A data manager from the University of Chicago and a physician from the Mayo Clinic were our auditors. At the end of a full day of review we were complimented on the quality of care we provide and the quality of research we conduct.

I am proud of the research we conduct, the quality of care and the quality of cancer research we are able to provide for our patients. It should be reassuring to our patients and community that outside auditors from major research institutions find the quality of our work and medical care to be exemplary. A Cancer Story

For most of us, having one or more careers and doing something you truly enjoy can be difficult. For Diana Carter, her working life has been filled with skills and experiences that mixed and matched including a reporter for a local newspaper (and writing her own column), starting her own media business where she scripted and directed commercials for radio and TV, as well as "jingles." Her vocal and musical talents led her to teach performing arts in the public schools. She has recorded several CD's, including one for children. Working with children of all ages seems to be her greatest passion.

In May 2013, she decided to sell her San Luis Obispo house and move closer to the ocean. She found herself living with one of her two daughters while she found a new home. It was at this time and during an annual check-up that blood work revealed an unexplained anemia. A mass was found during a colonoscopy and subsequent scans and tests confirmed Stage 4 colon cancer, which had spread to the liver.

Last June, Diana underwent chemotherapy to shrink the tumor, then was referred to UC San Francisco for surgery (most of the cancer was dead), then back home for more chemo. "I learned to relinquish control – to let go – and trust community." She continues in a funny, playful manner, "Be prepared to share the many details of your body and health." Diana credits humor as a vital and necessary

coping strategy for dealing with life, and most definitely a cancer diagnosis. She recommends watching funny movies to "keep things light and lift ones' spirits."

Diana has recently completed chemotherapy and now waits, along with her doctor for her CEA marker to return to normal. As she considers "what's next" she acknowledges a new 'freedom' to go forward and perhaps try new things. Diana is grateful for the love and support of family and friends, declaring she will 'pay it forward.'

Although she continues to wait for the final word regarding her Cancer, Diana is resolved to move on. She will stay positive and no matter what the future holds she is determined to fight. She has accepted several teaching assignments for the summer and no doubt will embrace each day with poise, grace and gratitude.

Blend all ingredients in a blender until smooth.


Hoops for Hope
