## PCR

Recent advances in cancer medicine are

mainly of two types that prove to be of great significance: (1) Immunotherapy treatments: Exposes cancers to the immune system by blocking molecules that cancer cells use to evade it. This is generally done with genetically engineering antibodies. (2) Enzyme inhibitors: Blocks one or more enzymes in one of the cascades of enzymes that lead to cell division.

Both treatments have the property that tumor cells can be tested to determine the likelihood of response. This allows people to take treatments more likely, and avoid side effects of treatments unlikely to help.

Two examples illustrate these concepts: A. Stage IV nonsmall cell lung cancer: A few years ago 50% of people with this disease lived only 1-year before dying and 2-year survival was only about 25%. Immunotherapies have increased the 2-year survival to about 40%, while about half of patients who are eligible for enzyme inhibitors live 3-years.

> B. Early stage breast cancer: At the beginning of my career, about 30% of our breast cancer patients



received chemotherapy after surgery (to improve their chance of cure). In June of 2018, the TaylorRX trial was published, helping us determine which women benefit the most from chemotherapy. As a result of this trial and others like it, we now use chemotherapy in only about 10% of women, those who benefit the most. This spares all of the others, the side effects of treatment.

It has been a privilege and rewarding to contribute to progress in cancer medicine. We had the TaylorRX trial open and remain active in immunotherapy research as members of the NCORP. The Jacqualyn Palchak Cancer Fund covers the salaries for the research staff that make our research program possible. **Thank you for your support.**

### The Recipe Corner

## IMMUNE BOOSTING CHICKEN NOODLE SOUP

from *Nourishing Plate* 

#### **INGREDIENTS**

1 tbsp. olive oil

1 medium onion, chopped

2 cups celery, chopped (ribs & leaves)

2 cups carrots, chopped

1 tsp. garlic, crushed

½ tsp. pepper

1/4 tsp. salt

1 tsp. thyme

1 bay leaf

8 cups chicken broth, low sodium

3 cups cooked chicken, chopped

1 (8 oz.) package egg noodles

Salt and pepper to taste

Zest and juice of one lemon

#### **DIRECTIONS**

Heat olive oil in a large saucepan over medium heat. Add onion, celery, carrots and garlic. Season with salt & pepper and sauté until vegetables are slightly softened, about 5 minutes. Add chicken broth, thyme, bay leaf and chopped, cooked chicken. Cook over medium heat for 20 minutes. Remove bay leaf and add egg noodles. Cook for 10 minutes or until noodles are soft. Remove from heat, add lemon juice & zest. Season with salt & pepper to taste.

#### The Benefits of Chicken Noodle Soup

- Carrots, celery and onion: Provide vitamin C and other antioxidants that support the immune system
- Broth: Provides hydration, soothes the throat and thins mucus
- Chicken: Provides protein and zinc to strengthen the immune system
- Noodles: Provide energy from carbohydrate and they taste good!
