New Colon Cancer Trial by David Palchak, MD

Oxaliplatin is one of our most potent chemotherapy drugs for treatment of stage IV colorectal cancer, but its use is limited by the poten-

tial for nerve damage.

The Pled-Ox trial, tests a new drug to prevent nerve damage, caused by Oxaliplatin treatment of stage IV colorectal cancer. It is a phase III trial initiated after smaller phase II trial suggested the new drug dramatically reduced the incidence of neuropathy.

PCR Oncology was the first office in the country to open this trial. This first-incountry privilege is a testament to our research staff, experience and hard work.

Tips that may reduce your Cancer Risk

According to the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics, your chances of developing cancer may be affected by the choices you make in the foods you eat. These six tips can help guide you in making better choices for a healthier life:

- 1. Eat plenty of vegetables, fruits, whole grains and legumes. Fill half your plate each meal with a variety of colorful fruits and vegetables.
- 2. Limit calorie-dense, nutrient-deficient foods with added sugars and solid fats such as sugar-sweetened beverages, processed snack foods and desserts.
- 3. Focus on eating plant proteins such as beans and lentils.
- 4. Moderate the portions of meat you eat, especially red meat. Processed meats such as ham, bacon, lunchmeats and hot dogs, should be eaten sparingly.
- 5. Limit your alcohol intake.
- 6. Keep a healthy weight with proper diet and exercise.
